Thoughts from a Pastor...

I recently returned from El Salvador, where I assisted a team from the Keystone Project. The trip was meant to connect with several churches and pastors in the country to share the Keystone Project's mission of Discipleship. The hope is to return in May for a large training event with the support of local churches and pastors.

I was down in El Salvador last January with Teaching Truth International and made several connections with people whom I was able to reconnect with during this trip. El Salvador is having churches springing up all over and has been experiencing new freedom since the president went to war with the gangs and locked them all up in prison. People can move around more freely and safely now. The churches are in a battle with the "health and wealth" movement. Many of the smaller churches are losing people to the larger churches that promise healing and wealth. These larger churches are able to put on a great show with lights and entertainment that draws the crowds. Does this sound familiar at all? On my trip here last January we had one of these prosperity gospel pastors crash our training so to speak, and set up screens and did a promotion for a big event that they were gearing up for. After they left, the team I was with actually spoke against that ministry and warned the people to not be drawn into it as it is a false gospel. My pastor friend Mauro, whom I reconnected with on this trip, shared with me that their church is losing people to those types of churches and it's their biggest battle for them.

I was privileged to preach in pastor Mauro's church while I was there and connect with many of the people in his church. I also made new connections with a few other pastors while down there. Pastor Tony pastors a church in Apopa, where I got to preach while there. Tony and his wife are personally financing his church in Apopa with personal loans completely dependent on God. They live in what was the most dangerous part of all of El Salvador when the gangs were running things. They minister to around 300 kids during the week and are seen as a safe place for people to be. They have a school for kids as well and appear to be very involved in their community.

I met with pastor Jaime from Santa Ana for a couple of hours in a coffee shop. He was unable to attend the training we had as his church has a large school. He wasn't able to get away for the training. It was encouraging to hear about the ministry his church is doing and his heart for discipleship. Their church is sending missionaries out to other countries, and he is working hard to help those in his church body to mature in their faith.

Thoughts from a Pastor...

Meeting with many different pastors and being all over the country, I was encouraged to see how God is at work. We serve an amazing God who is the Creator God. He formed these nations and is at work in them. They have many of the same problems we face in our churches, families, and marriages.

Singing and worshipping alongside others in a foreign language is powerful and a testament to how big our God is. It's easy to lose ourselves in our own life and not think about how big this world is and what God is doing in it. It was eye-opening to see God at work in my life. Someone of little importance from a small town in South Dakota finds himself in El Salvador preaching God's truth to people who do not speak the same language. Only God could coordinate this.

I do not know what seeds have been planted and or the impact that was had by our team while there, but God has a plan. We need to trust in that plan and lift up thanks to Him for being part of that plan.

Thank you for your support and encouragement for me to go on these trips.

Join the Christmas Story

This year for the Advent season we are looking at some of the various individuals involved in the Christmas Story. I will start this series off on Dec. 1 by looking at Zechariah and Elizabeth, the parents of John the Baptist. We will continue on through the month with different individuals and end December with a look at the story of the Magi. So anticipate reading along with us through the month and as you do various Advent activities pay particular attention to the role of various groups and individuals in that first Christmas.

I notice several things about the various individuals in the story. The first is that most of them were unexpecting of the significant role God would have them plan in this grand story. Zechariah and Elizabeth were quietly carrying out the duties of a priest and his wife, praying for a child. Mary and Joseph planning for a marriage and an average carpenters life together. Shepherds were just doing the mundane work of caring for sheep, even if they were the sheep for the temple sacrifice. Caring for sheep is about as mundane as life can get. Yet for all of them God had a delightful and even difficult surprise to be part of His grand story. My thought for us is to ask the question, Are we ready to participate in God's continuing story of living the gospel and sharing the gospel so more individuals can join the story? All it takes is to answer like Mary, "I am the Lord's servant, May it be to me as you have said". Luke 1:38

Continuing that thought I note that of the individuals I mentioned everyone willingly got involved with the story. They didn't know what it would all mean. Some may have seen the difficult challenges with their involvement. Like Mary and Joseph knowing no one would understand the pregnancy and they would face ridicule. Yet they all said "Yes, I am in for what you have for me to do, Lord."

I hope you have great joy during this Advent Season. I pray that some of this joy comes from being available and seeing what the Lord does and how he uses us to expand the story of a Savior who has come into the world. It has been great news for each of us. Now through us it will become great news for even more.

Our family also moved apartments on campus – our new space is better suited for our family long-term, and we are thankful for the opportunity that was given us to move.

Summer was full and fast – the boys got to experience Rainbow Bible Ranch for the first time in June, and of course, had a blast! It was special to have our children be at a camp that was formational for our own lives. In July, Timberline hosted three weeks of family camp, called Ascent Weeks, which Lisa coordinates. The time in the Word and fellowship together among guests and staff was rich and fruitful – we saw the Lord work deeply in the hearts of many adults that felt stuck in the daily grind of life.

In August, Lisa was bitten by a dog (outside) and a bat (inside) in the same week. Praise be to Jesus, neither of them had rabies. However, the following weeks were a battle against fear and anxiety, and she is still dealing with anxiety, especially when outside alone. Please pray for ongoing protection of body and mind for her.

This fall the boys returned to a small Christian school in our community. From what they know, many of their classmates do not have a personal relationship with Jesus, and each boy has opportunity within their classes to be salt and light. Our boys have soft hearts towards the Lord right now, and we see them respond to His leading. Isaiah got baptized in November, and we praise God for this step of obedience!

Andrew continues to meet with a small group of men from our community biweekly, and Lisa is mentoring two staff ladies this fall. And of course, we are walking with the current group of students who came in September. Each year it seems as though the level of trauma and depth of hurt that students come with grows larger, and it is true again this year. Pray for God's powerful work of healing in their lives.

Through it all, God's faithfulness and goodness are so clear to us. Isaiah 41:10 says, "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

He has indeed upheld us! Thank you, Little White Church, for being a part of the way God has ministered to us and supported us this year.


"I am leaving you with a gift—peace of mind and heart. And the peace I give isn't like the peace the world gives. So don't be troubled or afraid." John 14:27


