From the Worship Pastor

Hey there Church Family,

About a month ago, I was speaking with a friend (a new believer) who said he had never read through the Bible. Many of us have attempted to read the entire Bible in a year, using different plans and often, we get behind on a few days, feel overwhelmed, and eventually, give up. Reading through the Bible in a year is a daunting task, but of course, definitely worth the journey. This friend of mine had said, instead that he was listening to the Bible from a podcast and invited me to join him. As an encouragement to him as a new believer, I said "absolutely!", and began the journey. Very soon, I realized how precious this experience has become to me.

Often, we begin the year with a "new year's resolution," and this is not all bad. Resolutions to quit addictive behaviors, take time to pray, or spend our mornings reading scripture can often jumpstart us into a lifelong path that brings us closer to the image we were designed to become. However, statistically, about 80% fail resolutions almost immediately, another 10-12% hang on a bit longer, and only about 8% find any success. This is because determination can only take us so far. Regarding the things of God, many of us struggle with one area of brokenness or another. For some, putting the Facebook down, and getting our face in the Book has been a struggle (guilty here!). For many, addiction to pornography, alcohol, or gambling is a struggle that many cannot seem to overcome. Still others find feelings of suicide, depression, or bitterness as a close companion that never seems to leave, no matter how many times they have prayed.

Yet God has provided the grace necessary for us to overcome. We have been "created in His image and in His likeness." "If anyone be in Christ, he is a new creation. Old things have passed away, and behold, all things have become new." Dozens more promises such as these ensure that God has provided a pathway for us to find freedom from the power of sin in our lives. "We are no longer slaves to sin." As Romans 6 says, is a powerful reminder that we are children of God when we are found in Christ Jesus.

But where is Jesus? He is sitting next to you at church. He's in the "She Brews" gathering. He's in the nursery playing with toys. He's helping supply the food pantry. He is everywhere that we are. We are the Body of Christ. Everyone has heard the story of the man in a storm who said "God will save me," yet refused the help that God gave by sending two boats and a helicopter. Yet oftentimes, God works in the same way in our own lives. If my friend would not have approached me to listen to the Bible in a Year with him, I certainly would not have begun it on my own. And, since he is sticking with it, so am I. We were designed as brothers and sisters, mothers and fathers, sons and daughters, to be united in Christ as one single body. When one part of the Body is hurting, the entire Body hurts. So too, when one brother or sister is a light, it shines in us and through us as well as an encouragement and a source of joy.

Our struggles should not find us isolated in a vacuum, but just as Elder Danny Martinez once said, we instead should be surrounded by "wise, sincere, loving friends". Friends that are closer to us that our own siblings. Our life groups are a great place to begin. Celebrate Recovery is also a fantastic place to find that freedom that Christ promises. This is because of the strong unity in the Body found there. I'm thankful for my friend's encouragement. The love that binds us togeth-



er as family is strong enough to overcome our weaknesses, our faults, and our frailties. Unconditional love is not offended by the mess, but loves us too much to leave us in it. Rather than our determination or "resolution," let our source be the love Christ gave us.



Keeping the Family Strong

THE FUTURE OF OUR FAMILY

On a recent Sunday, the Ministry Moment featured the church nursery. As I listened to Dominique Beck's presentation, I realized a sad truth about our nursery . . . one that could also apply to our children's church. We often take these valuable services for granted . . . ("someone's in charge"; "someone will do it"; "they don't need me").

If we don't have small children, we probably don't even think about it. In that case, we're probably not putting much effort into praying for it, either. So, today, I want us to take a good, hard look at WHY these programs are so valuable to our church family.

Yes, you read that correctly. Nursery and Children's Church programs benefit **all** of us. Think about what they actually DO. The nursery gives parents of infants and toddlers a chance to sit back, relax, and REALLY listen to the sermon. Children's Church offers the same opportunity to parents of kids who are ages 4 through 3rd grade. What a blessing for those parents!

Remember how hard it was to keep *your* little ones occupied? To keep them quiet so others could hear what was being said by someone in the room? If those parents are trying to achieve that in a church service, or any other teaching/learning situation, it's a sure bet they'll miss a lot of priceless lessons along the way! Seeing to the needs of a child simply takes their attention away from whatever is being said.

But, if those parents can *truly* pay attention to the message being taught, they will learn things that will help them to be better parents — better teachers & guides to those little minds with whom God has entrusted them. If they are able to clearly *learn* the lessons the pastor is teaching, they will be better able to *teach* those lessons to their children.

Okay, so . . . what about the folks who *provide* those services? The ones who teach Children's Church, or help out in the Nursery? Do YOU know who does that every week? I know I don't! What happens if the same few people are *always* — week in and week out — teaching Children's Church or working in the Nursery?

THEY become the people who are missing the sermon — every time they provide that service. Each week they serve, THEIR souls are missing out on being fed by the Worship music, prayer time, and the message in that week's sermon. Missing the chance to have their spirits refreshed and energized for the week ahead.

However, if enough people are signed up to help, the work can be spread out over a wider time frame. Instead of missing the Sermon every 3 or 4 weeks, they may only be called on once every two months or so. That is the goal of Dominique and Nicole — the women in charge of these two vital programs: enough volunteers so that a person is only needed once every couple of months.

Kitchen Ministry is in need of pots & pans, regular dinner forks, crockpots, toasters, baking sheets, pizza pans and cake pans.


Furniture ministry is in need of twin and queen size box springs for participants that have earned items thru the Work-2-Earn Program.
