Missions Moment—Black Hills Pregnancy Center

The Black Hills Pregnancy Center is a Christian ministry to all in the Black Hills area that need support for their pregnancy, planned or unplanned. We meet women where they are, and we minister to them through our support and actions.

Our Mission Statement:

"to proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ to men and women facing pregnancy decisions as we provide educational, as well as spiritual, physical, and emotional support in a loving confidential environment."

Our services are free of charge and include:

Pregnancy Testing, Limited Ultrasound, Earn While You Learn Parenting program, Baby boutique, Mentorship, Fatherhood Program, Medical Consultation Referrals, Adoption Referrals, and Abstinence Education.

We could not fulfill our mission without financial partnerships or without the many volunteers that donate time to serve in many areas. Some areas we need to fill now include: Earn While You Learn Educators, Fatherhood program mentors/leaders, also men to be in the center during business hours to have conversations with the men that come in with their girlfriend, administrative and receptionist help, and more advocates and nurse volunteers.

We also need business sponsorships for events like our Walk for Life event, Client party events, Ladies Tea and our annual Fundraising Dinner.

So far for this year we have had a 30% increase of new clients, with a 20% increase of boutique shopping, 21% increase for pregnancy tests. If you want to directly impact the lives of men, women, and children in the Black Hills area, this is a place where you can serve and see that impact.

Bible Study Fellowship (BSF) has three groups who meet here at LWC once a week. Worldwide over 600,000 men and women are studying Revelation this year. We just finished Chapter 6. It can be a hard and sobering study.

The following is taken from Greg Laurie's book - "Revelation - A Book of Promises" speaking of Chapter 6.

"The successive horsemen look like this: the white horse comes, ridden by a so-called good guy who is really a bad guy. He is followed by a red horse bringing war, which is followed by a black horse representing famine and disease and all the terrible aftermath of a worldwide conflict. Inevitably, death on the pale horse, comes next.

It makes me think of what scientists call a nuclear winter, which follows a nuclear blast. The Los Angeles Times published an article that said such a winter would ultimately kill more people that the original atomic explosion.

This scenario, unimaginable to previous generations, could easily unfold in our time. Why would God permit this? Because He is a God of justice, and He has determined to let evil run its course before He establishes His kingdom of right-eousness.

Nevertheless, remember this: even during this hellish Tribulation period, the Lord will extend opportunity after opportunity for people to turn from their sins, believe, and be saved.

These chapters in Revelation present a bleak scenario, don't they? It certainly demonstrates what the ultimate result of sin will be on our world and reminds us that sins - even so-called little sins - are nothing to play with or take lightly.

The Antichrist is close. He could be alive today. But the Bible doesn't tell us to watch for the Antichrist; it tells us to watch for Jesus Christ.

Right now the restraining force in the world is the Holy Spirit working through the church of Jesus Christ. But once the church is removed in the Rapture, the Antichrist will be revealed." (I realize there are different views on the timeline of future events - but I believe the warnings that follow from 1 Thess. 5 apply no matter the timeline. - Bonnie)

"So how should we live?

Wake up. Verse 6 - Let us not sleep, as others do. There are people in the church today who are lethargic, passive...and don't bother to watch the signs of the times. There seems to be a disconnect between their so-called spiritual lives and their real, walking-around-on-earth lives. So the Bible is saying that we need to wake up to the urgency of the time. We need to open our eyes to what is transpiring all around us and give some thought to the nearness of the Lord's return.

Sober up. Verse 8 - Let us who are of the day be sober. Luke 21:34 - Be careful, or your hearts will be weighted down with carousing, drunkenness and the anxieties of life, and that day will close you suddenly like a trap. (AMP) says "But be on guard, so that your hearts are not weighted down with the giddiness of debauchery and the nausea of self-indulgence."

As for me, I don't want to be under the influence of anyone or anything but Jesus Christ and His Holy Spirit. Paul was saying, "Don't let yourself become overly preoccupied. Don't make your life about the pursuit of fame or money or material possessions. Stay alert..."

Suit up - Verse 8 - Putting on the breastplate of faith and love, and as a helmet the hope of salvation. As Bible teacher Warren Wiersbe has said, "The Christian life is not a playground; it's a battleground." If you are a Christian, you're in a battle whether you like it or not.

Someone might say, "Well, I don't like war. I'm a spiritual pacifist." All right. Then prepare to be defeated - or devoured.

Every believer needs to learn how to strap on his or her armor and learn how to handle the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God. As you wait for the Lord to come, Wake up, Sober up, and Suit up."

(December 15, 2024) It was shortly before sunrise when I sat down to prayers this morning. Most of the sky is crystal clear, so there are no sunrise colors building in the sky to the east. But there **WAS** a show in the **western** sky!

My window looks out to the northwest. There, hanging in a gap between some **approaching** clouds, was the moon. Full and luminous last night, it is as bright as a light bulb this morning! As I watched, I thought about the moon's nature . . .

Amy Carmichael (1867-1951), an Irish Protestant missionary, served in India for 55 years. Much of her work was with children, especially rescuing them from sexual slavery. Carmichael wrote 35 books and many articles about her mission work. The Church of England remembers her on January 18, the anniversary of her death.

The following brief but powerful prayers are attributed to Carmichael:

- May thy grace, O Lord, make that possible to me which seems impossible to me by nature.
- Holy Spirit, think through me, till your ideas are my ideas.
- God, hold us to that which drew us first, when the cross was the attraction, and we wanted nothing else.




